

Message from the Pastor



Trinity

May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all. (1 Corinthians 13:14)

A family was traveling with their 3-year-old daughter to the Atlantic Ocean for the first time. When they got to the beach, the little girl ran out to the water with a little pail in her hand. She managed to scoop up a little water amid the small waves, then ran back all excited. "Mommy! Daddy! I've got the ocean in my pail!"

Trying to comprehend the nature of God is like trying to put the ocean in a little pail—our puny little minds just can't grasp something so great. We only can express what God has told us in his Word, the Bible. God gave glimpses of himself in the Old Testament, to Moses when he proclaimed his name, the LORD (Ex. 34:5-7), and when Moses said, "Hear, O Israel; the LORD our God, the LORD is one" (Deut. 6:4). Yet, in the Old Testament we get hints of a plural nature within God, when he spoke at creation, "Let us make man..." (Gen. 1:26). The 3-fold repetition of the LORD's name in Aaron's benediction (Numbers 6:23-26), and the 3-fold repetition of his description as holy by the angels in Isaiah 6, speak of a "threeness" of this on God.

The New Testament adds more knowledge about God to us. God revealed himself to us in the person of Jesus Christ, who said, "I and the Father are one" (John 10:30), and "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father" (John 14:9). In the above passage, and in Matthew 28:19, the three persons of God are listed as Father,

Son, and Holy Spirit. To help us get a handle on this description of God, the early church coined the word "triune"—three in one—to describe God as being three persons, yet one, undivided God.

The first Sunday after Pentecost is known as Trinity Sunday. On that day we contemplate the mystery of God's nature, and how he has been revealed to us as one God, three persons. We've learned this in confirmation class, but we won't ever come to a point where we can say we know all there is to know about God. That would be like the girl saying she's got the ocean in her little pail. The teaching of the Trinity humbles us, but it also makes us grateful to know that the LORD is our God, that he loves us, and that we'll get to spend eternity with him in heaven, thanks to the second person of the Trinity, Jesus.


