True Freedom

It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery. (Galatians 5:1)

"Freedom Days" has returned to North Freedom. The last weekend of June is a busy time for our little village, hosting hundreds of visitors enjoying carnival rides, fair food, and a grand parade which our congregation is participating in. Then, in just a few days we'll celebrate the Fourth of July and the freedoms that we enjoy in our land since the Declaration of Independence was signed 249 years ago.

Our country treasures its freedoms. We enjoy the right to worship without government interference, free speech, freedom of the press and freedom of assembly, the right to bear arms, and other freedoms in the Bill of Rights. Some political parties, especially the Libertarians, want to expand our freedoms and get rid of certain laws that make many drugs illegal and penalize companies from polluting.

Freedom is certainly on our minds these days. But what is "true freedom"? Is it the freedom to do what we want, when we want it? Such "freedom" would actually be slavery. Jesus said, "Everyone who sins is a slave to sin" (John 8:34). The one who says, "I don't have to go to church, I want to stay home watching TV on Sunday morning" is a slave to his sinful nature. So is the one who lies, who breaks speed limit and traffic laws. Sin is not freedom, it's slavery.

True freedom won't happen by our attempts to obey the law, either. We could try to keep

every law, obey every commandment, and still we find ourselves slipping. Even so-called "little" sins are enough to condemn us.

True freedom can only come from our Savior Jesus Christ. Jesus fulfilled all the laws for us, and also endured the curse of the law by being hung on the cross. Paul wrote in Gal. 3:13: "Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us, for it is written: "Cursed is everyone who is hung on a tree."

Christ has set us free to enjoy our freedom! No longer are we bound to all the Old Testament regulations like the Sabbath on Saturday law, circumcision for every 8-day-old baby law, and the like. We have true freedom now, not to do what our sinful nature pleases, but to do what pleases God. True freedom is serving our Lord and living for him alone. Stand firm, fellow Christians, in your freedom in Jesus!
