Advent

A voice of one calling: "In the desert prepare the way for the LORD; make straight in the wilderness a highway for our God." (Isaiah 40:3)

It seems that the whole month of December, as well as the last few days of November, should be called the Christmas season. Christmas specials are on TV, radio stations switch to holiday music, and Christmas decorations are seen everywhere.

But the church's Christmas season doesn't begin until December 25, Christmas itself. Before we get to Christmas we go through the season of Advent. Advent starts on the 4th Sunday before Christmas, which this year is Nov. 30, and ends on Dec. 24, Christmas Eve.

The name "Advent" means "coming." You can understand why it's called that. Christmas is coming! Of course—but there is more to it than that. It also reminds us that our Lord who came is coming again. Like the believers of the Old Testament all the way to John the Baptist, we need to prepare the way for the Lord.

The above passage was a prophecy of the one who prepared the people for the Messiah's immediate coming. John the Baptist, Jesus' relative (see Luke 1), came to the wilderness region by the Jordan River to proclaim the message: "Prepare the way! The kingdom of God is near!" He called on the people to repent of their sins. John baptized those who repented and put their trust in the Lord. He assured them that they were forgiven and they were ready for the Lord's coming.

As we go through our season of Advent, let's not get so distracted by busy schedules and events that take us away from Christ. Every day, prepare the way for the Lord's coming. Let's make our lives straight and prepare a highway for our God to come into our lives. Let's come to church each Sunday, confessing our sins, receiving the news that we are forgiven, and believing in our Savior.

The Lord is coming! Prepare for our Savior's birth, and for his coming at the end so he may take us to heavenly bliss and life eternal!
